CONGRATULATIONS!

It is rare to visit an art gallery and see your own face. Steve M^cQueen *Year 3* is a celebration of who you are, along with 76,000 other children who are shown here with you.

I AM HERE, YOU ARE HERE, WE ARE HERE! Use the words to fill the gallery.

Take it in turns to say out loud I AM HERE. Turn to someone next to you and say YOU ARE HERE. Gather together as a group, try speaking all together and say WE ARE HERE.

Build from a whisper to a roar, and back again.

WHO AM I?

Gather near your class photograph, close your eyes and remember back to the day this photograph was taken.

What was the weather like?

What were you thinking?

What else was happening that day?

What had you dreamt the night before?

Think about yourself back THEN in Year 3 and NOW in Year 4.

Some things about you will be the same, some things will have changed. Some you will have noticed, others perhaps not. What do you like NOW that you didn't before? What did you believe THEN that you don't anymore? How might you be different now? 'Photographs are a way of reminding ourselves about where we come from and where we are going.'

WHO ARE WE?

You are in the Duveen galleries. Look up, around and across this huge space that runs down the middle of Tate Britain. There are hundreds of children here today who helped to make this artwork possible. On this page is a map of the gallery you are all in. Turn around 360 degrees to work out where you are right now.

Use all your stickers to capture this moment. You could:

Put a sticker on the page to mark where you are standing or sitting.

Think about where the most noise is coming from.

Notice who is moving in the gallery.

Who is grabbing your attention?

Exhaust all thoughts, ideas and possibilities for how to capture this moment – and then keep going.

See where this takes you.

SUPER CHALLENGE!

Hold hands with a partner until the whole class is connected. See if your class can stretch from one side of the Duveen galleries to the other. Can you work as a class to make a connection with another group? Is anyone brave enough to join on to your line?

WHO ARE YOU?

It is important to be open and imaginative when encountering other people in the world. The ability to understand and share the feelings of another is called empathy.

There are many things that make you different to the other children in this massive portrait. There are also many things that make you the same. Some differences can be seen, and some cannot. Some similarities can be seen, and some cannot.

Think for a minute about everything that makes you YOU, the visible things and the invisible things.

'We take photographs so we can celebrate our individuality and enjoy our differences.'

Now spend some time getting to know some of the pupils in other photographs on the walls.

Work with a partner.

Choose a pupil in a photograph at random who you don't know.

In your heads, think about everything that makes them THEM.

Imagine a life story for them.

Tell your story to your partner, and listen to theirs.

ALL TOGETHER NOW

Spend some time thinking about the thousands of faces on the walls. Like you, each child lives and learns in London and has grown a little older since they were photographed. Imagine for a moment the hundreds of thoughts, experiences, hopes and dreams of all these children.

Bring all the voices from across London together. What might your shared message to the future be?

DISCOVER TATE BRITAIN

Time to explore the rest of Tate Britain. Tate has a collection of over 70,000 paintings, sculptures, photographs, films and even sounds and performances. Some of them are hundreds of years old and some of them were made this year. They are all owned by the nation. This means you, your family and friends and all the other people here today. Tate's job is to look after these artworks for everyone.

Now discover other artworks in Tate Britain today. Remember – you don't need to know anything about an artwork or an artist to start exploring it. A good way to do this is to ask questions, to share ideas, and to imagine stories.

TURN THE PAGE TO FIND ACTIVITIES TO HELP YOU START YOUR EXPLORATION.

TALKING TO ARTWORKS

Find a room you like that is not too busy and spend some time looking at all the artworks.

There are lots of ways of spending time with art. Some artworks you might like straight away, some you might not.

Work with a partner to get to know a few of the artworks really well.

Take it in turns to ask questions, and to imagine the artworks are answering you – telling you their story.

Are other visitors interested in what you are doing? Perhaps they are learning something from you about the art in the room.

DISCOVERING ART CAN BE NEW, SURPRISING, AND SOMETIMES CONFUSING. REMEMBER THERE ARE NO RIGHT OR WRONG WAYS TO RESPOND. 'Of course photography is art, everything is art, we are art, our insides, our body, and as long as your heart is beating, you are art.'
